

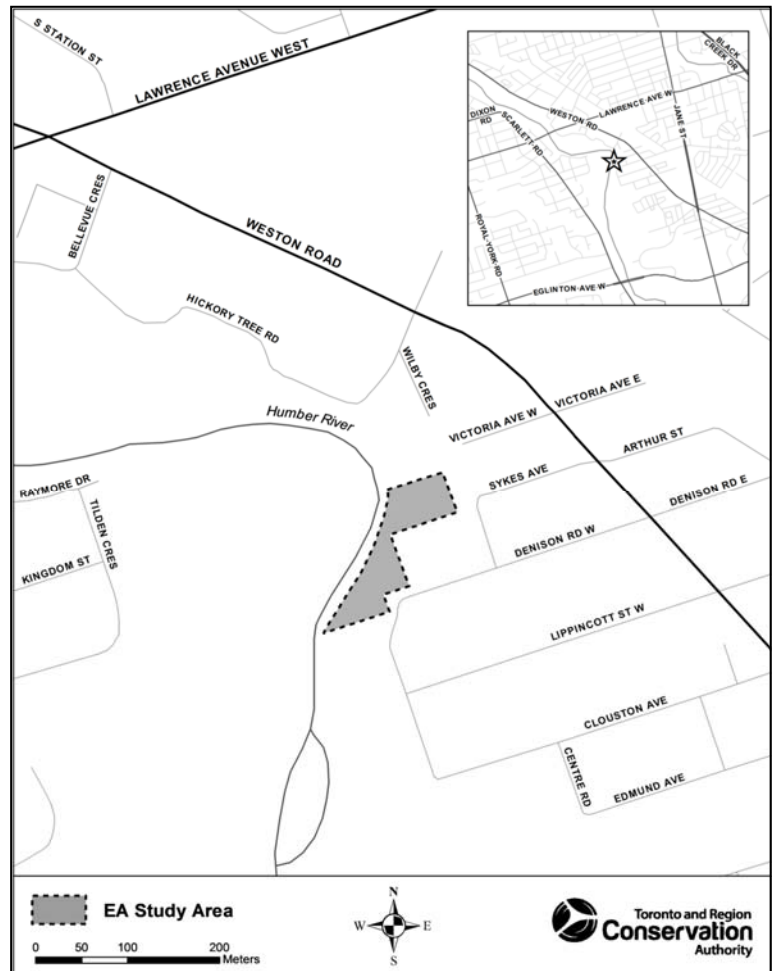
NOTICE OF INTENT

DENISON ROAD UPPER SLOPE STABILIZATION PROJECT IN THE CITY OF TORONTO

Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (TRCA) has commenced a study to investigate possible slope stabilization measures for the upper valley slope instability and erosion, which is impacting residential properties at 48, 50, 52, and 66 Denison Road West and 28 Sykes Avenue, in the City of Toronto.

As part of the study, the cause and extent of the slope instability will be determined, and alternative solutions to address the risk will be evaluated. Once complete, a design for the preferred alternative will be finalized and implemented, resulting in long-term protection for essential structures at the top of the slope in the study area.

This project is being planned in accordance with Conservation Ontario's *Class Environmental Assessment for Remedial Flood and Erosion Control Projects (amended 2013)*, the approved process for this type of undertaking. TRCA invites you to participate in this study which includes public and stakeholder engagement. Your input will be incorporated in the planning and design process for this project.
